National Caregiving Author, Expert Joins Local Board of the Alzheimer's Association Sherri Snelling, CEO of Caregiving Club, helps raise funds and awareness in Orange County

NEWPORT BEACH, CA (November 1, 2018) – The growing epidemic of Alzheimer's disease has a new champion in the fight as the Orange County chapter of the national Alzheimer's Association welcomes caregiving author and expert, Sherri Snelling, CEO of Caregiving Club, to its board.

Snelling, author of <u>A Cast of Caregivers – Celebrity Stories to Help You Prepare to Care</u>, has been a longtime advocate for Alzheimer's disease which is the third leading cause of death in Orange County and impacts more than 150,000 local residents – those with the disease and their family caregivers. The local Orange County chapter is one of more than 70 local chapters across the country of the national Alzheimer's Association that does three things: 1) Funds national and international research to find a cure faster; 2) Provides information and resources about critical care, education and support to the local Orange County families affected, and 3) Advocates both in Sacramento and Washington, D.C. for continued national research funds and legislation for those impacted by this disease.

"I'm proud to lend my voice and support to the Alzheimer's Association about a disease that is still not widely understood and continues to carry a stigma for families, which prohibits diagnosis and finding support," said Snelling. "The physical, emotional and financial tolls of this disease impact the whole family and affect our home life and our work life."

Snelling added that in Orange County, Alzheimer's is double the rate of cause of death (3rd) versus the rest of the nation (6th). And, women are disproportionately impacted as they represent two-thirds of those with the disease and three in five of the family caregivers.

Although current Alzheimer's research shows promise, this neurodegenerative disease affecting memory, thinking and behavior, still has no proven preventive measures, no ability to slow the degenerative nature of the disease and no cure. According to the latest *Facts and Figures* report from the Alzheimer's Association, 5.7 million are living with the disease in the U.S. costing the nation \$277 billion last year. The number of those with Alzheimer's is expected to more than double to 14 million by 2050. It is this looming epidemic that creates an urgency to fuel research, advocate for legislative action and provide local community support for families affected.

"We're delighted to have Sherri join our board as she has been a longtime supporter for Alzheimer's, family caregivers for this disease and the impact on employers," said Anne Grey, executive director of the Orange County chapter of the national Alzheimer's Association. "Our board, volunteers, program partners and sponsors, scientific researchers and staff are all in this together – it is a herculean effort but we believe we can 'END ALZ."

Snelling cites recent VIP activity in the fight to find a cure for Alzheimer's as a promising sign. In the last few months, Bill Gates has pledged more than \$100 million to fund research, create a more efficient diagnostic tool and support innovative ideas from start-up entrepreneurs in addressing Alzheimer's which has impacted his father. Others who have recently pledged to address Alzheimer's are AARP's "Disrupt Dementia" campaign (\$60 million to the Dementia Discovery Fund), Mark Zuckerberg's foundation (\$5 million) and the NFL Players Association.
